
My name is Matthew Ramsey and I am an Assistant Professor in the Department of Cell and Molecular Biology at the University of Rhode Island. I have had the pleasure of teaching Amanda in two semesters here at URI as part of my CMB211 Integrative Microbiology course.

As before she was immediately one of the best students and now despite the material being more review and a bit simple for her, she still came to each lecture, fully engaged and full of good questions. Even when her performance basically guaranteed her an A grade in the course she still attended and showed a great interest in the subject. It has really been a privilege to have her as a student. I have had numerous personal conversations with Amanda regarding her earlier issues with the course as well as her application here. She is by far more mature, determined and motivated than 99% of her peers. I have no hesitation suggesting that she would be a great fit in a collaborative graduate research environment.
