In consideration of publication of the Work in Journal of Bacteriology ("JB"), the American Society for Microbiology ("ASM") requires that the Author transfer the copyright in the Work (including the text, figures, tables, artwork, abstracts, cover art, and errata) to ASM and license to ASM certain non-exclusive rights in the Supplemental Material.
